There is a growing and desperate need for men's issues to be discussed. Want examples?

- Women are treated better in all aspects of the legal system, and receive lighter sentences and a higher chance of acquittal for being women [1].
- Men are significantly more likely to be the victims of violent crime (including rape) than women [2], and over 76% of homicide victims are male.
- Despite domestic violence being equally committed by women [3], for the most part only male perpetrators are arrested.
- Men comprise 95% of workforce deaths [4].
- Men commit suicide at four times the rate of women; 80% of suicides are committed by males [5].
- Men are doing worse in all aspects of the educational system, from kindergarten to university [6], yet are overwhelmingly ignored.
- ~80% of homeless are men [7]
